

Sat. 6th Dec. Arrival in Accra, Ghana

Participants will be picked up at the Airport and dispatched to their hotel Overnight stay at the Airport View Hotel (or similar) in Accra

Sun. 7th Dec. Accra – Cape Coast (By Road)

Participants will depart from Accra on a comfortable coach ride to the Central Region. Upon arrival, we will visit the historic Cape Coast Castle, where they will walk through the Door of No Return, retracing the footsteps of our ancestors and reflecting on their profound journey. Next, we will explore Kakum National Park, where the breath-taking Canopy Walkway offers stunning views and a unique wildlife experience. Visitors can also enjoy the park's modern camping facilities. Afterwards, we will pause for a relaxing lunch before making our return journey to Accra.

Overnight stay at the Airport View Hotel (or similar) in Accra

Mon. 8th Dec. Accra City Tour (By Road)

The group will embark on a scenic coach ride through Accra, exploring the city's rich history, vibrant culture, and iconic landmarks. Along the way, participants will visit notable sites such as the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum, the Art Centre, Independence Square, and the bustling Oxford Street, gaining insight into the heritage and dynamism of Ghana's capital.

Overnight stay at the Airport View Hotel (or similar) in Accra

Tues. 9th Dec.

Accra - Tamale (By Air) - Tamale - Bolga (By Road)

Participants will board a flight to Tamale for their departure from Accra. Upon arrival in Tamale, they will be picked up and embark on a bus journey to Bolga, where they will check into their hotel for the night.

(Overnight stay at the Akayet Hotel (or similar) in Bolga)

Wed. 10th Dec. Cultural Roots Tours in Paga (By Road)

We will depart early in the morning for Paga township, where we will be led by His Royal Highness Nagonaab, Na-Pariyoung Kosom Asaga Yelzoya II, the Paramount Chief and President of the Nabdam Traditional Council to pay a courtesy visit to the Paga Pio's Palace to begin with our tours. His Highness will guide the group on a visit to the Pikworo Slave Camp, a historically significant site that once served as a holding area for enslaved people before their journey to the slave market in Salaga and all the way to the coast. In the afternoon, we will begin our return journey to Tamale, passing through the Tongo Hills and the sacred Tengzug Shrine and also stop over for lunch as well as (Pito), a special Northern Region Traditional beer.

(Overnight stay at the Nim Avenue Hotel (or similar) in Tamale)

Thurs. 11th Dec. Street / Cultural Carnival – Tamale

Today is the much-anticipated Street/Cultural Carnival, a vibrant celebration of Northern Ghana's rich cultural diversity. The event will feature stunning displays of traditional attire, flavourful local cuisine, lively parades, and captivating performances. Participants will experience the region's deep-rooted heritage through exhilarating music, dance, artistry, musketry, and impressive equestrian displays. Additionally, an exhibition of local artefacts and traditional items will be on display, offering a glimpse into the region's artistic and cultural legacy.

(Overnight stay at the Nim Avenue Hotel (or similar) in Tamale)

Fri. 12th Dec.

Youth Forum/ Fashion Show - Tamale

Participants will have the opportunity to attend a forum at Tamale Polytechnic, specially designed for young people to engage in meaningful discussions on topics such as youth development and entrepreneurship. Later in the evening, a vibrant fashion show will showcase the unique Northern fabrics, reimagined in contemporary styles, highlighting the region's rich textile heritage and modern design creativity.

Overnight stay at the Nim Avenue Hotel (or similar) in Tamale

Sat. 13th Dec.

Palace Experience / Musical Concert - Tamale

In the morning, we will visit the Buipewura Jinapor II Palace, where participants will receive a warm traditional welcome, including kola nuts and vibrant cultural displays. Guests will have the opportunity to experience the rich customs of the Buipe community, listen to ancestral stories, and gain insight into their deep cultural significance. The day will conclude with a grand musical concert, featuring talented musicians from Northern Ghana. This electrifying event will celebrate the region's artistic and musical heritage, showcasing its dynamic rhythms and creative expressions.

Overnight stay at the Nim Avenue Hotel (or similar) in Tamale

Sun. 14th Dec. Tamale – Accra (By Air)

After breakfast, participants will check out and be transferred to Tamale Airport for their flight back to Accra.
